NATURE PLAY SA CUBBY BUILDING STEM CHALLENGE EXCURSION

On Monday June the 20th (week 8) we have a whole school excursion planned at Belair National Park to become involved in

Nature Play SA's cubby building STEM challenge. Through a series of team challenges, students use natural, open-ended resources to problem solve, design, and build imaginative cubby creations. They will be using cooperation and resilience as their keys to success and learn about sustainable practices.

This proves to be a fabulous excursion and with many thanks to the Parent Club and Governing Council this excursion will be free for all students to attend.

The bus will be leaving at 8.15 am and return to school at 4.45pm so bus students will need to be dropped off and picked up from school on this day, as we will be leaving earlier and returning later than the bus times. All students will need to be at school by 8.10 am, bring their lunch already prepared in a disposable wrap, recess, and some snacks as it will be a long day, along with a water bottle.
