A Department run program that is specifically designed to build Teacher's pedagogical content knowledge as well as enhance the ability to design mathematics learning that engages children and builds their ability and confidence in mathematics. It also creates opportunities to learn about developing numeracy skills across the curriculum.

### WHOLE SCHOOL ACTIVITIES



Ancient Egypt has been a popular theme for our Friday Whole School learning. Our writing focus for Term 3 is Information Texts, so we are using our learning about Egypt to learn to research and construct this text type. We are practicing our note taking and highlighting skills, as well as how to put facts into our own words.

#### **HOW DID THEY BUILD THE PYRAMIDS?**

We have explored and experimented some of the different strategies that experts believe the Egyptians may have used to build the Pyramids. We think that some of them could have worked.







We have enjoyed translating our names into Hieroglyphics and have created some codes that people need to crack!

As always, the students have been super busy in Agriculture. The upper primary has started the Mushroom in schools' program. This is a program aimed at the 3/4 year levels but due to the school being provided with 5 mushrooms kits, I thought the whole Upper Primary class could participate. The students started the boxes this week and over the next few weeks should start to see some mushrooms start to grow. Did you know that a mushroom double in size every day? The students will also be provided with a lot of theory work to go with this program.

The students have also been working on an orchard task, looking at what fruit trees the school currently has, what fruits trees they would like to grow and the requirements that these trees require to flourish at the school. As part of the planning process, we were lucky enough to have Carrie Hayes come in and have a chat to the students about what the trees need and what we need to do in the space we want to plant them.

The aquaponics is still going well and the students are enjoying feeding the fish.

The Junior Primary class has been planting potatoes and weeding their vegetables patches. The worms are growing in numbers rapidly and the students enjoy checking them each week.
